Grading Procedure and Guidelines 2023/24

The Grading Process

- 1. Players are allocated to a team by Club Registrar or Independent Team Organiser via PlayHQ.
- 2. Clubs & Independents can nominate a grade for each team via PlayHQ.
- 3. Club Registrars to complete & return the 'Team nomination spreadsheet', noting any special grading considerations for their teams.
- 4. The HRBA Competition Manager will distribute the teams to allow appropriate numbers of teams per age / division.
- 5. The Grading Team meets and reviews team distributions and adjusts as necessary. They will consider:
 - Previous season results and ladder placement.
 - Registrars team nomination notes i.e., same team name but new players, WABL allocation etc.
 - How each team sits within their playing group. This can result in the team being viewed differently by the Grading Team compared to the Registrar's perspective.
- 6. The HRBA Competition Manager drafts proposed fixture matrix of paper graded teams.
- 7. HRBA Referee Coordinator reviews proposed fixture matrix to determine required referee resourcing. Changes may be recommended based on referee availability.
- 8. Competition commences.

Week 1

- Individual Grading Team members circulate and observe teams in play. Observations are collated for consideration by the Grading Team.
- Wins / Losses with a 30+ point margin are set for mandatory review.
- Round 1 ladder position, points and percentages are compared within the cohort.

Week 2

- ➤ Week 1 fixtures are reviewed the Grading team may request a match- up between certain teams for further scrutiny.
- Individual Grading Team members circulate and observe teams in play. Observations are collated for consideration by the Grading Team.
- ➤ Wins / Losses with a 30+ point margin are set for mandatory review
- ➤ Ladder position, points and percentages are compared within the cohort.

Week 3

➤ Week 2 fixtures are reviewed – the Grading team may request a match- up between certain teams for further scrutiny.

- > Grading Team circulates and observes all teams. Exceptions noted if further observation needs to be considered.
- ➤ Wins / Losses with a 30+ point margin are set for mandatory review
- > Ladder position, points and percentages are compared within the cohort.

If a Team is Regraded:

- Clubs & Independent teams are advised that a team has been regraded.
- Fixtures are redrawn.
- Competition ladder commences as of round 4; no adjustment to competition points for rounds 1 − 3 required.
- Club Registrars & Independent team officials have one week to lodge a formal, written query disputing a team's regrading. After this time, grading will be considered final.

Grading Disputes:

If a Club or Team disagrees with any promotion or relegation of their team/s, then the following process must be followed.

- Write to the Association with the grading query / issue:
 - i. Clearly define and outline the query / issue.
 - ii. Provide any supporting documentation / evidence relevant to the grading dispute.
- Submissions from Coaches, managers or parents that have not been submitted via the Club will not be given consideration.
- Empowered Club representatives can informally discuss grading with Grading Team members or HRBA staff, but this will not constitute a formal query.
- Coaches, managers, or parents are not to approach the Grading Team regarding queries / issues. Furthermore, being abusive or badgering the Grading Team or HRBA staff regarding grading will result in implementation of the Zero Tolerance Policy.
